

Speaking in Dallas, Texas

Commentary for January 18, 2008 — Scheduled to Speak Four Times

I have been invited to represent ASK and Dr. Martin's work by speaking at a Symposium that will take place in Dallas, Texas over four days: January 30th, 31st, February 1st and 2nd, 2008.

however, the cost of parking shall be your responsibility.**

As I understand arrangements at the present time, the event has been organized and funded by Art Mokarow, Tom Roberts, Al Carrozzo, and his son Tom Carrozzo. (As you may recall, Al and Tom Carrozzo helped arrange two events for me to speak in Southern California last November.)

The purpose of the Symposium is to initiate discussions and contacts involving cooperation among several organizations to provide a knowledge resource base of biblical study and research. In other words, the purpose of the Symposium is to inform individuals and organizations about various educational materials we have to offer. ASK certainly fits within that goal and it has a great deal to offer. Note the following works by Dr. Martin and myself:

- His book *Restoring the Original Gospel* with its discussion of the design, development, and structure of the Holy Scriptures, should be used as a basic textbook for every group Bible study.
- His book, *The Star that Astonished the World*, gives important historical background information about the period and issues surrounding the birth of Christ and the true nature of the Star of Bethlehem.
- His book, *The Secrets of Golgotha* educates people about the historical nature and proper location of Christ's crucifixion.
- His small book, *The Tithing Dilemma*, helps free people from the tyranny of non-biblical tithing.
- His book *The Temples that Jerusalem Forgot* shows the proper location of the Jewish Temples in Jerusalem, an issue that is the centerpiece of Middle East problems today.
- His book, *The People that History Forgot* informs people about the mysterious Samaritans and how they led the world-wide heresy of Gnosticism that led to the orthodox (so-called) Christianity that afflicts the world today.
- His book, *101 Bible Secrets* provides fascinating digest-sized articles expanding the understanding of the Bible.
- Dozens and dozens of articles on all subjects.

For my part I am pleased to offer material I researched on the Tomb of King David of Israel, and about the Sons of God, as well as researched articles I have written, and the presentations from *the Byte Show*. These all make for a varied and useful educational resource.

ASK has much to offer participants of the Symposium, both to organizations and individuals. To the extent God's *ekklesia* benefits from such efforts, ASK will be pleased to participate.

The first general subject of the Symposium will be "Law and Grace." Final speaking schedules will follow in a few days. I do not know at this time when I will give my presentations, but I have been asked speak four times:

- (1) I will present information about ASK — its past, present, and future. This will be about 10–15 minutes.
- (2) Under the general subject of the Symposium, "Law and Grace," I will present a PowerPoint presentation on "The Deficiency of the Ten Commandments."

Later, perhaps on separate evenings, I have been asked to give two presentations that I have given elsewhere:

- (3) "The True Site of the Jerusalem Temples" and
- (4) "The Location and Future Discovery of King David's Tomb."

The Symposium will be held at a downtown Dallas hotel:


