Temple and Tomb Presentation — March 29, 2007 — Portland, OR

I have been invited to deliver a visual presentation and lecture on Dr. Ernest L. Martin's Temple evidence to the local Portland congregation of the Church of God (Seventh Day). I want to invite all of you in the Portland area to attend, particularly if you have not seen this presentation of Dr. Martin's compelling research. It is one thing to read about the correct site of the Jewish Temples, it is another to see it and understand issues more completely.

The information I will present shows that the proper location of the Jewish Temples in Jerusalem must be above and west of the Gihon Springs, the only source of water in the Jerusalem area. The proper site was one third of a mile south of the false "temple mount" (the Haram esh-Sharif), the present site of the golden Dome of the Rock and the al-Aqsa Mosque. This lecture will be Part 1 of an extended two part lecture. Part 2 will be given at a later date (which has not yet been set).



In Part 2 of the lecture I shall show the location and future discovery of the Tombs of the Jewish Kings David and Solomon. These Tombs are in close proximity to the correct Temple location. Dr. Martin's Temple research gives vital information needed to locate the Tombs at Jerusalem. Historical and biblical sources indicate clearly that the bodies of King David, Solomon, and possibly others as well are in the unopened Tombs. It is believed that the Tombs are intact and will yield more important information and documents than any ancient tomb, including the Tomb of King Tutankhamen.

The location is in east Portland, east of the I-205 & I-84 bypass near the intersection of 112th Street on NE Sacramento Avenue in Portland.

Temple/Tomb Presentation — May 13, 2008 — Wauwatosa, WI


I have arranged to speak at the Wauwatosa Public Library on Tuesday evening, May 13, 2008 at 7 p.m. I will give a combined Temple/Tomb presentation lasting 1-1/2 hours. The address is 7635 W. North Avenue (on the corner of Wauwatosa Avenue [76th Street] and North Avenue).

Having been raised in Wauwatosa (a western suburb adjacent to Milwaukee), and having spent hundreds of hours at that public library, I know this facility very well.

There is plenty of parking and the location is central to Milwaukee and the surrounding area.

So, at present two presentations are scheduled: one on March 29 in eastern Portland, Oregon and the other on May 13 in Milwaukee,

Wisconsin. Mark your calendars if you live in either of those areas. I will give details of additional presentations in those two cities later as they are scheduled.

- Attempts are being made to arrange an additional presentation in either Racine or Kenosha in southeast Wisconsin also in May 2008, but I cannot yet give you details.
- A Tomb presentation may be scheduled for April 2008 again at the Church of God (Seventh Day) church.

- In November 2008, God willing, I plan to be in Providence, Rhode Island and Boston, Massachusetts to attend professional conferences.
