

ASK Temple DVD Reviews

Commentary for May 17, 2013 – Some Comments from Supporters

We received many compliments on the DVD film, *Jerusalem and the Lost Temple of the Jews*, and I will quote some of them in this Commentary. Most of those purchasing the DVD did so because of the [free movie trailers](#) on the ASK website.

One correspondent wrote: **"I received the film and watched it twice. It is very well done, and at the first watching, I got goose bumps."** It seems that most who have commented on the DVD have not only appreciated it, but they mentioned they watched it twice, three times, or even more. This is not surprising. This film is packed with information and watching it the first time, it is easy to miss an important point.

Some have placed additional orders for multiple copies for friends or relatives. We at ASK are grateful that you liked the film, and are willing to share this presentation of Dr. Martin's research of the true site of the Jewish Temples in Jerusalem. Another compliment:

"It's a great production and we enjoy it much. It has to have an effect in getting the information out."

I agree with this sentiment. This was the goal of Producer-Director Ken Klein's; he greatly desired to present this important biblical and historical evidence. He did a great job.

At the right is a photo of Ken and me waiting near the Pool of Siloam in Jerusalem almost two years ago. We were about to enter a newly opened dry drainage tunnel that proceeds north from there. This Herodian tunnel or channel increases in elevation a distance about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile, exiting at the Davidson Center at the southeast corner of the Haram esh-Sharif. This modern tourist center houses a museum.



The Davidson Center is next to the outside area where Prof. Benjamin Mazar began the Jerusalem dig in the summer of 1969, when Dr. Ernest Martin participated in that dig for five summers from 1969 to 1973, supervising students and guiding VIPs from the United States. This north/south tunnel was not discovered until after the true site of the Siloam pool was uncovered by archaeologists in the autumn of 2004. It was excavated quietly and opened a few years ago to the public.¹

Since release of the DVD, Ken and I have spoken often that we feel the film will renew interest in Dr. Martin's research and evidence, and will have an impact on events. We are surprised at the diversity of views of some who find the film fascinating. Another compliment:
